Why a Master's in Research Methods (MRes)?

The MRes at the University of Chichester:

- emphasises independent study over taught instruction;
- provides a structured, flexible approach;
- enables development for applied professional practice;
- offers fundamental, extended research methods training on areas of specialist practice.

The course is **part time taken over three years**. The curriculum has 3 taught modules which include research methods, theories and concepts.

In addition, a discipline specific module can be taken in any related field of work.
